

MARATHON PETROLEUM LIFE INSURANCE PLAN (Basic and Optional Life Insurance Premium)

This is a summary of the annual report of the Marathon Petroleum Life Insurance Plan (age-based), EIN 31-1537655, Plan No. 558, for period January 01, 2020 through December 31, 2020. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Insurance Information

The plan has a contract with Metropolitan Life Insurance Company to pay life insurance claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending December 31, 2020 were \$16,367,292.

Because it is a so called "experience-rated" contract, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending December 31, 2020, the premiums paid under such "experience-rated" contract were \$16,367,292 and the total of all benefit claims paid under the contract during the plan year was \$14,353,630.
